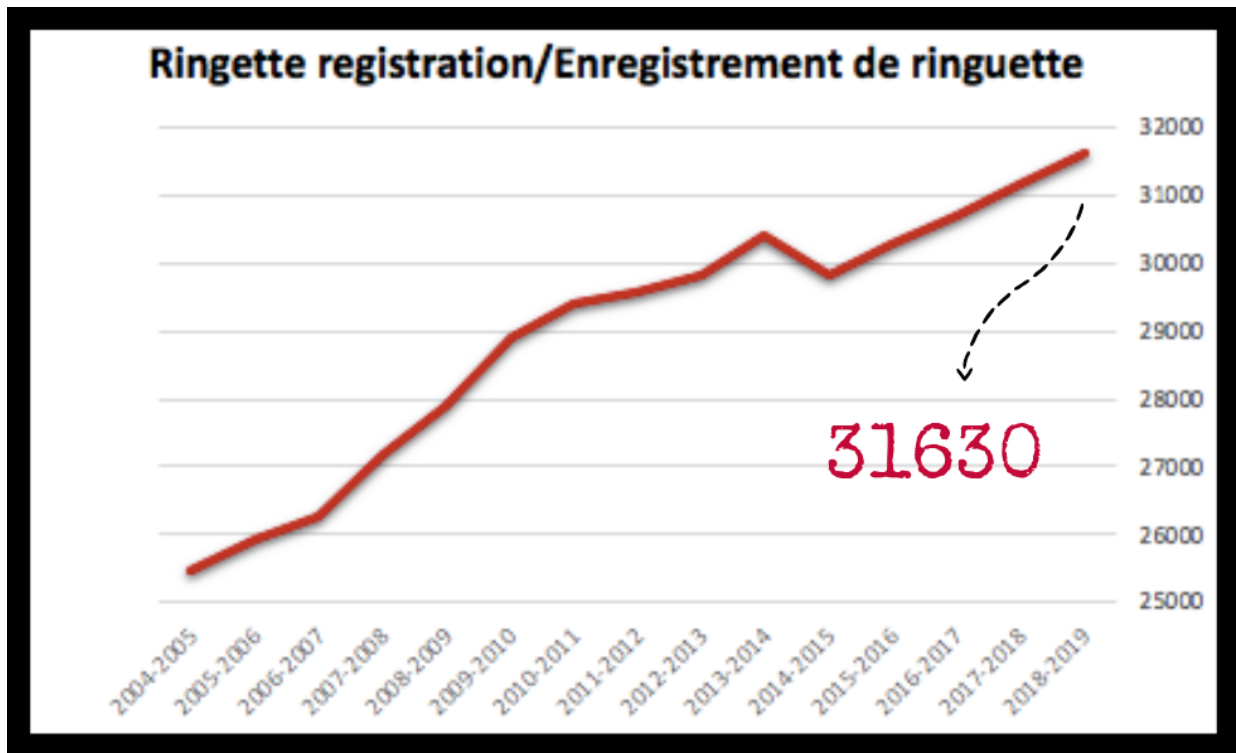

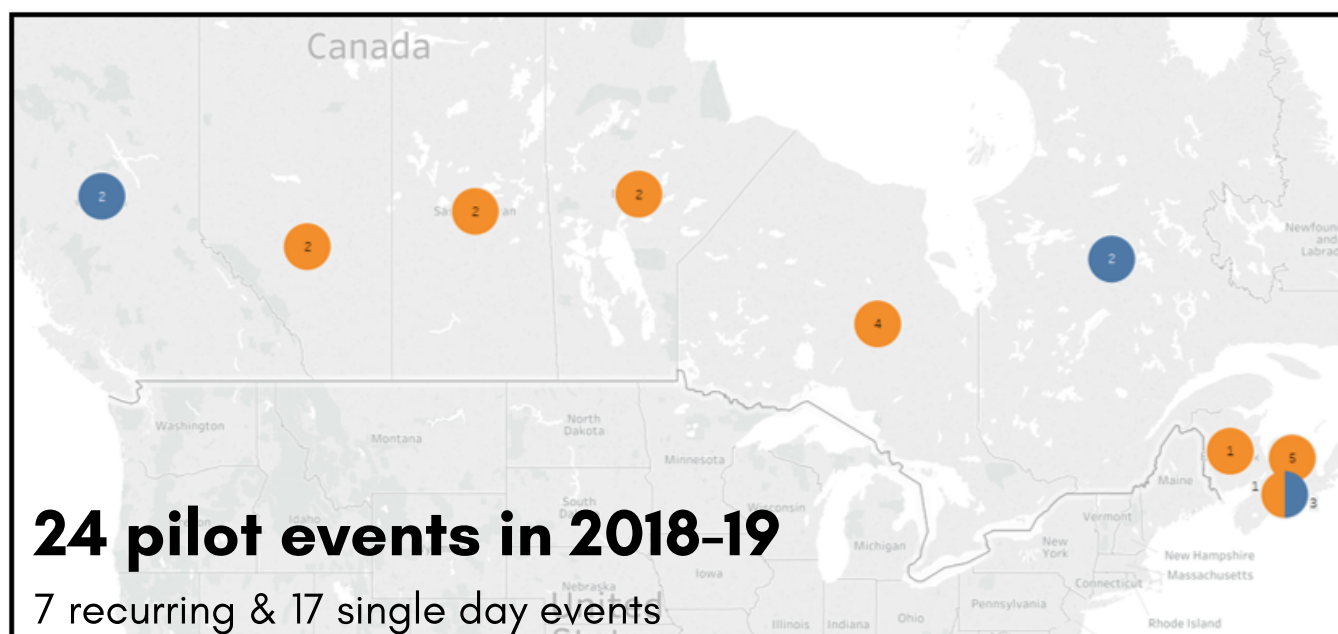
CHILDREN'S RINGETTE

Small-area games were piloted across the country as the Children's Ringette initiative reached the program development phase. Program feedback was collected via surveys from 503 players, 63 coaches & 230 parents. Children's Ringette continues to grow with national implementation of small-area games at the U8 level & below for the 2019-20 season.
